I recognize the importance of following instructions regarding proper technique(s), safety rules, guidelines, and regulations. I understand that I am ultimately responsible for my own safety, and I agree to abide by all rules and regulations governing the activity(ies).

I acknowledge that I fully understand that my participation is outside the course and scope of my employment duties, and my employer's workers' compensation coverage is not applicable to my participation in this voluntary event.

I assume any and all risk of bodily injuries to myself, including medical, dental, or hospital bills, permanent or partial disability, death, and damages to my property, caused by or arising from my participation in the event/activity(ies).

I further acknowledge that the Agency does not provide any type of insurance including liability, collision, comprehensive or medical coverage for participants who provide their own transportation or provide transportation to other individuals in connection with the event.

I understand that I am releasing claims and giving up substantial rights, including my right to sue, and am doing so voluntarily. No representations, statements, or inducements, oral or written, apart from the foregoing written statement, have been made.

Parade Rules and Regulations

- All parade entries must check in to the Parade Marshal by 8:00 am. Failure to check in on time will result in your entry not being allowed in the parade.
- All participants enter the parade at their own risk.
- All minors under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.
- Police Officers and Parade Marshalls have the authority to remove any person or entry from the parade when, in their judgment, parade guidelines are being violated. Anyone not obeying the law can be cited or arrested for violations.
- Possession or consumption of alcohol by any group member will result in the entry being removed from the parade.
- Smoking or tobacco products are prohibited.
- Floats may not exceed 13 feet in height, 10 feet in width, or 40 feet in length not including the towing vehicle.
- The number of riders on a float or motorized entry may not exceed maximum vehicle weight limitations. Additional participants may walk along beside the entry.
- Individuals will not be allowed to ride on the hoods or outside of vehicles.
- Vehicles must have enough fuel to complete the parade route.
- All participants riding or standing on floats or motorized vehicles must wear safety belts, have hand holds, or back supports while the floats or vehicles are in motion.
- Portable generators used in conjunction with float lighting must be securely mounted on a vehicle or other substantial base. A minimum of 12 inches clearance must separate any part of the generator from combustible fabric or decorating material. At least one five-pound dry chemical or ten-pound carbon dioxide fire extinguisher must be placed within easy reach of the float driver. There should be at least one fire extinguisher near each generator.
- Wiring and lighting devices must have sufficient capability for the use intended. Wiring should be properly secured to avoid mechanical damage and injury to float riders.
- Fire or open flame, compressed gases, and containers of gasoline are prohibited.
- Firearms, fireworks, and other loud noise makers are prohibited.
- All entries must have identification signs on both sides or on the front with a minimum of six inch letters. Each entry will be given a number at check in which must be displayed in a highly visible location.
- All motorized entries may be accompanied by additional walking group members who may carry props. Walkers will be judged as part of the entry and should be suitably costumed to add to the theme.
- Float and motorized entry drivers must be in attendance at all times during line up and the actual parade to move the entries as needed.
- The driver should be adequately trained to drive the float and have clear visibility of the road ahead.
- All entries must maintain forward movement no faster than 5 mph. There will be no stopping for photographs or other activities that will impede the progress of the parade.
- Candy and other trinkets may be soft tossed to parade attendees. Great care should be taken to prevent injury caused by candy or beads being thrown into the crowd with force.
- Each unit must be present at the designated time and location to begin line up on parade day. Failure to check in with the parade marshal by 8:00 pm will result in the entry being cut from the parade.
- Music played on or from a parade entry must be radio edited.
